

first lesson

1 Samuel 2

Samuel was ministering before the Lord in the Temple as Hannah, his mother, had promised God he would if God blessed her in her barrenness by giving her this son. He was just a young boy, and he only wore linen underwear. But each year when Hannah went up with her husband, Elkanah, to make the yearly sacrifice at the Temple, she would make a little new robe for her son, Samuel. Then Eli, the priest, would bless Elkanah and Hannah, and say, "May the Lord repay you with more children for this gift you have made to the Lord"; (Eli was referring, of course, to Samuel and not to the robe) and then Elkanah and Hannah would return to their home. And the Lord took note of Hannah; she conceived and gave birth to three more sons and two daughters. And the boy Samuel grew up in the presence of the Lord.

second lesson

Matthew 2:1-12

In the days of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, behold Sorcerers, Magicians, Fortune-tellers and Astrologers - the Magi from the East - came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born 'King of the Jews?' For we observed his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was anxious, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born.

They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet:

'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel.'" [Micah 5:2]

Then Herod secretly called for the Magi and learned from them the exact time when the star had fluoresced.

Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage."

When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. Beholding the star, they rejoiced with exceedingly great joy! On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary, his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they presented him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they withdrew for their own country by another road.

GOSPEL Luke 2

The child *Jesus* grew and became strong, was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him.

Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return *home* the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travelers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. But all who heard him were ecstatic at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Child, why have you treated us like this?

You knew, didn't you, that it is necessary for me to be about my Father's business?" But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom, and in maturity and grace in the presence of God and man.

nicene creed

A: Let us pray:






