confession & forgiveness

- *P: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.* **C: Amen.**
- A: Do not despair in the darkness of sin for God has manifested our salvation.
- C: God of truth and light, you have revealed and fulfilled yourself in giving us your son Jesus the Christ.
- A: God now abides with us; guiding, strengthening, forgiving and renewing us each day.
- C: Yet, we confess that we do not always recognize your presence in our lives. We trust in our own wisdom and strength rather than yours. We live in fear rather than in peace. We tend to despair rather than find hope. We choose the ease of sin rather than the way of faithfulness. Seeking to live by your design and not our own, we ask for the grace of your forgiveness. Do not turn away from us, but, as we turn toward you again, visit us even more intimately, becoming the catalyst for our repentance and renewed resolve.

P: Arise, shine, for our light has come, and the glory of the Lord has arisen upon us. As a Called and Ordained minister of Christ's Church, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins in the name of the Father and the Son of the Holy Spirit. Amen.





C: Heavenly Father, as Andrew and Peter heard the call of Jesus and followed him as his disciples, so open our ears to hear and respond. Stir up your Spirit within us and within the Church, that we will not be distracted from following our Savior as his faithful people. In His name we pray, Amen.

first lesson

Isaiah 8:9 - 9:2

Come together, you peoples, and do not be happy; listen, all you faraway places; Wrap your arms around yourselves and do not feel comfort. Make your plans together, but they will not work out; Say what you want, but what you say will not happen, for God is not with you. God is with us.

This is what the Lord said to me while his hand was strong upon me. He warned me not to do what those other people were doing. God said: Do agree with them about what is wrong with the world. Do not fear what they fear. Think of the Lord and his holiness. Respect the Lord. The Lord will become a safe place for you, your security; but for Israel the Lord will become something they stumble over—a trap to capture all the people of Jerusalem. And many will stumble and be trapped. They will be captured and carried away. Make sure everyone knows that this is true. I will wait for the Lord, who is hiding his face right now. I will hope in the Lord. See, I and the children whom the Lord has given me are signs from God to God's people.

Now if people say to you, "Consult the ghosts and the spirits that haunt - 'boo!" And if they say to you; "Pray to the idols, the dead wood, so you can have life." These people are still in the dark. They will not find the answers that they are looking for. They will be hungry and frustrated and will blame their kings and their gods for their problems. They will look up to the sky and down to the ground looking for hope, but they will only see air and dirt. They will have no hope.

But there will be no darkness for those who are in trouble now. God did cause trouble for his people before, but now God will make them happy again. God's people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness—on them light has shined.

Psalm 62:5-12

For God alone my soul waits in silence, for my hope is from God.

God alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall not be shaken.

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen.


And Jesus said to them, "Come follow me and I will make you fishermen of people."








A: Let us Pray.




