First Lesson

Isaiah 8:9-9:1-4

They will look at the sky and they will look at the earth and they will be depressed by what they see. But God's people will be in the light. They will have freedom from worry and concern. They will be as joyful as when a birthday cake is cut, and everyone gets a piece. Anything that brings them down, God will lift up and God's people will be free.

Second Lesson

1 John 2

John (not John the Baptist) writes: My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, "The Righteous One;" and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also the whole world.

And if we may obey his commandments, we know that we have come to know him. Whoever says, "I know him," and is not keeping his commandments is a liar, and in such a person "The Truth" does not exist. On the other hand, whoever may obey his word, truly, in this person, the

wholistic love of God is perfected. Whoever says, "I obligate myself to remain in Christ," then, as Christ walked about, so this person should walk about, too – and this is how we will know that we are in Christ.

Beloved, I am not writing you a new commandment, but reiterating an old commandment that you have had from the beginning - the old commandment is the Word that you have heard. Yet, I am writing you a new commandment that is true in Christ and in you - that the darkness is being eclipsed and "The True Light" shines. Whoever says, "I am in 'The Light,'" and goes about hating a brother or sister is really still in "The Darkness." On the other hand, whoever loves a brother or sister lives in "The Light" and in such a person there is no cause for someone to them and lose their faith. But whoever hates another believer is really in "The Darkness," is walking in "The Darkness," and does not know the way to go, because the darkness brings on blindness.

Jesus Begins the Work of His Ministry

But having heard that John *the Baptist* had been handed over to King Herod and put into prison, Jesus withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

"Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles-- the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." [Isaiah 9:2]

From *that point on* Jesus began preaching and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of the heavens has come near."

Walking along the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea--for they were fishermen.

And he said to them, "Get behind me and I will make you 'Fisherman of People.'"

They immediately let go of their nets they followed him.

Going on from there, *Jesus* saw two other brothers, James, son of Zebedee, and his brother, John, in the boat with their father, Zebedee. They were mending their nets. And *Jesus* called them and they immediately left their boat and their father and followed him.

Then *Jesus* went throughout all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

So, his fame spread throughout all Syria, and they brought to him all the sick - those who were afflicted with various diseases and pains, demoniacs, epileptics, and paralytics - and he cured them. Great crowds followed him from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea, and from beyond the Jordan.






The Lord's Prayer





Donations for the annual Super Cereal Bowl of Caring are coming in and we are already over 200 boxes! But your help is still needed to


