## prelude confession & forgiveness

- *P*: *In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.* **C: Amen.**
- A: Do not despair in the darkness of sin for God has manifested our salvation.
- C: God of truth and light, you have revealed and fulfilled yourself in giving us your son Jesus the Christ.
- A: God now abides with us; guiding, strengthening, forgiving and renewing us each day.
- C: Yet, we confess that we do not always recognize your presence in our lives. We trust in our own wisdom and strength rather than yours. We live in fear rather than in peace. We tend to despair rather than find hope. We choose the ease of sin rather than the way of faithfulness. Seeking to live by your design and not our own, we ask for the grace of your forgiveness. Do not turn away from us, but, as we turn toward you again, visit us even more intimately, becoming the catalyst for our repentance and renewed resolve.
- P: Arise, shine, for our light has come, and the glory of the Lord has arisen upon us. As a Called and Ordained minister of Christ's Church I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins in the name of the Father and the Son of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

#### Deuteronomy 18:15-20

Y ahweh your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own people; to this prophet you will listen, according to all that you sought from Yahweh your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly, saying: "If I hear the voice of Yahweh my God anymore, or ever see this great fire again, I will die."

And Yahweh said to me: "They have done well in their speaking; I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their own people; I will give my words into this prophet's mouth and I will speak to them whatever I command the prophet. And it shall be: Anyone who does not listen to my words which this prophet speaks in my name, I myself will require a reckoning from that person who does not listen. But, the prophet who presumptuously speaks a word in my name that I have not commanded that prophet to speak or who speaks in the name of other gods, --that prophet will die."

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. The Lord's praise endures forever.


## second lesson


#### 1 Corinthians 8:1-13

**P**aul writes: Now concerning food sacrificed to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." "Knowledge" puffs up, but love builds up. Anyone who claims to "know" something does not yet have the necessary knowledge; but anyone who loves God is known by God. Hence, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "no idol in the world really exists," and that "there is no God but one." Indeed, even though there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth--as in fact there are many gods and many lords--yet for us there is one God, the Father,

from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist. It is not everyone, however, who has this knowledge. Since some have become so accustomed to idols until now, they still think of the food they eat as food offered to an idol; and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. "Food will not bring us close to God." Yes, it is true that we are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do, but take care that this liberty of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. For if others see you, you who possess "knowledge," eating in the temple of an idol, might they not, since their conscience is weak, be encouraged to the point of eating food sacrificed to idols? So, by your "knowledge" those weak believers for whom Christ also died are destroyed. But, when in this way you sin against members of your family and wound their conscience when it is weak, you also sin against Christ. Therefore, if food is a cause of their falling, I will never eat meat, so that I may not cause one of them to fall.

### gospel acclamation

*P: The Holy Gospel according to Mark the First Chapter.* **C: Glory to you, O Lord.** 

#### <u>Gospel</u>

Mark 1:21-28

Jesus and His disciples entered into Capernaum and immediately, on the Sabbath, Jesus went into the synagogue and taught. Those in the synagogue were astounded at Jesus' teaching, for he taught them like a teacher who has authority, unlike the scribes.

And immediately there was in their synagogue a man in an unclean spirit, and the unclean spirit cried out saying, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God."

But Jesus spoke a word of power to the unclean spirit, saying, "Be silenced, and come out of him."

And the unclean spirit, convulsing the man and crying with a great cry, came out from the man.

And those in the synagogue were all so astonished by what happened that they argued among themselves saying, "What is this? A new teaching? With authority? And he commands the unclean spirits, and they obey him?"

And the news about Jesus immediately went out throughout the surrounding region of Galilee.




#### A: Let us Pray.








## post-communion prayer


