First	Lesson

1 Kings 17

Then the word of the Lord came to *Elijah* saying, "Go now to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and live there; for I have commanded a widow there to feed you."

So, Elijah set out and went to Zarephath.

When Elijah came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks.

Elijah called to her and said, "Bring me a little water in a cup so that I may drink."

As she was going to bring it, he called to her again and said, "Bring me a small piece of bread in your hand."

But the widow said, "As the Lord your God lives! I have nothing baked! I only have a handful of flour left in a jar, and only a little oil left in a jug. I was just now gathering a couple of sticks so that I may go home and prepare the flour and oil for myself and my son, so that we may eat our last meal, and then die."

Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid. Go and do as you have said but first make me a little cake of the flour and oil and bring it to me. Then,

afterwards, make something for yourself and your son. For thus says the

Lord the God of Israel – 'The jar of meal will not be emptied, and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the Lord sends rain on the earth.'" She went and did as Elijah said, and she, as well as Elijah and her whole household ate for many days. The jar of flour was not emptied and neither did the jug of oil go empty – just as the word of the Lord spoken by Elijah said it would happen.

After this, the son of the woman who was the head of the house became ill! His illness was so severe that there was no breath left in him. The woman who was the head of the house, the boy's mother, then said to Elijah, "What have you against me, O man of God? You have come to me to bring my sin to remembrance, and to cause the death of my son!" But Elijah said to her, "Give me your son."

Elijah took him from her bosom, carried him up into the upper room of the house where he was staying, and laid him on his own bed.

Elijah then cried out to the Lord, "O Lord my God, have you brought calamity even upon the widow with whom I am staying by killing her son?!?"

Then Elijah stretched himself over the child three times, and cried out to the Lord, "O Lord my God, let this child's life come into him again." The Lord listened to the voice of Elijah; the life of the child came into him again, and he revived. Elijah brought the child down from the upper room, into the house, and gave him to his mother.

Then Elijah said, "See, your son is alive."

So, the mother said to Elijah, "Now I know that you are a man of God, and that the word of the Lord in your mouth is truth."

Psalm

19

The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims God's handiwork.

Second Lesson

2 Kings 5

N aaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favor with his master, because by him, the Lord had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from leprosy. Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. This servant girl said to Naaman's wife, "If only my master was with the prophet who is in Samaria! That prophet could cure him of his leprosy." So, when Naaman heard this, he went and told the King of Aram just what the girl from the land of Israel had said.

And the king of Aram said, "Well, go then! I will send along a letter to the king of Israel."

Naaman went, taking with him ten talents of silver, six thousand shekels of gold, and ten sets of garments. He also brought the letter to the king of Israel which read - "When this letter reaches you, know that I, King of Aram, have sent to you my servant Naaman, that you may cure him of his leprosy."

When the King of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God that I can give death or life? Why, then, does this man send word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? Look! See how the King of Aram is trying to pick a quarrel with me, the King of Israel"

But when Elisha, the man of God, heard that the King of Israel had torn his clothes, Elisha sent a message to the King of Isreal, saying, "Why have you torn your clothes? Let Naaman come to me, that he may learn that there is a prophet in Israel."

So, Naaman came with his horses and chariots and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house.

Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored and you will be clean from your leprosy."

But, Naaman became angry and went away, saying, "I thought that for me, the prophet would surely come out and stand and call on the name of the Lord his God, and would wave his hand over the leprous spot, and cure me! Are not the Abana and the Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them and be clean?"

Naaman turned and went away in a rage.

But Naaman's servants approached him and said to him, "Just suppose the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more should you do what he says when all he said was, 'Wash, and be clean'?"

So, Naaman went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan River - according to the word of the man of God – and Naaman's flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and Naaman was clean.

Then Naaman returned to the man of God, he and all his company. Naaman came and stood before Elisha and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Please, accept a present from your servant."

But Elisha said, "As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing!" Naaman urged Elijah to accept the present, but Elijah refused.

Then Naaman said, "If not, please let two mule-loads of earth be given to your servant. For, your servant will no longer offer burnt offering or sacrifice to any god except the Lord. But may the Lord pardon your servant on one count - when my master goes into the house of the god Rimmon to worship there, leaning on my arm, and I bow down in the house of Rimmon, when I do bow down in the house of Rimmon, may the Lord pardon your servant on this one count."

Elijah said to him, "Go in peace."

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel

Luke 4

And in the power of the Spirit Jesus returned to Galilee and a report about him spread through all the surrounding countryside. Jesus taught in their synagogues, where everyone applauded him.

And Jesus came to his hometown of Nazareth, the place where he had been nurtured in the faith, and he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, as he always did. He stood up to read a lesson from the Holy Scriptures and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him, which he unrolled until he found the place where it was written:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because Yahweh has anointed me, Yahweh has sent me to preach a word of hope to those who have been given no reason to hope: to proclaim release for those who are now captives; and to give sight to those who are now blind; to send those who are now oppressed out in liberation to proclaim an acceptable year of the Lord." [Isaiah 61]

And Jesus rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. All the eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him.

Then Jesus began to say to them, "Today this scripture is being fulfilled in your ears."

Everyone witnessed about him and were amazed at the words of grace coming out of his mouth.

They said, "This is Joseph's son, indeed!"

Jesus said to them, "No doubt you will quote to me this proverb,

"Charity begins at home"

And you will say,

'What we heard that you did in Capernaum, do here now in your hometown!'"

But then Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is acceptable in the prophet's hometown. But, the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of the prophet Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months and there was no rain, and there was a severe famine over all the land of God's people. Yet, Elijah, the great prophet of God, was sent to none of them except to a widow in the foreign land of Zarephath, in faraway Sidon. There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except the foreigner from Aram, Naaman, the Syrian."

And hearing this, the whole synagogue was filled with rage. They got up, threw Jesus out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built so that they might hurl him off the cliff. But Jesus, having gone through the midst of them, went on his way.


Apostles Creed
