

FIRST LESSON

One who forgives an affront fosters friendship, but one who dwells on disputes will alienate a friend. A rebuke strikes deeper into a discerning person than a hundred blows into a fool. Better to meet a she-bear robbed of its cubs than to confront a fool immersed in folly. Evil will not depart from the house of one who returns evil for good. The beginning of strife is like letting out water; so stop before the quarrel breaks out. A friend loves at all times. and family are born to share adversity. The crooked of mind do not prosper, and the perverse of tongue fall into calamity. The discerning person looks to wisdom, but the eyes of a fool to the ends of the earth. One who spares words is knowledgeable; one who is cool in spirit has understanding.

Even fools who keep silent are considered wise; when they close their lips, they are deemed intelligent.

A fool takes no pleasure in understanding, but only in expressing personal opinion.

SECOND LESSON

James 4

Which one of you thinks they are wise and have understanding? If that's who you think you are, you should show by your good life that everything you do comes from a gentleness that is born from wisdom. But, instead, if your hearts are full of bitter envy and selfish ambition, then don't be boastful and false to the truth that this kind of "wisdom" does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, and devilish. For, where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. On the other hand, the wisdom that does come from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. There will be many blessings of peace for those who make peace. . .

Do not speak evil against one another, brothers and sisters. Whoever speaks evil against another or judges another, is thinking that they have become the "law" and in doing so, corrupts that law and makes themselves into someone who thinks they are above the law. In reality, though, there is one lawgiver and one judge who is able to save and to destroy. So, who, then, are you to judge your neighbor?

Listen up those of you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a town and spend a year there, doing business and making money," yet you do not even know what tomorrow will bring. You really think you have total control of your life? Listen, you are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes!

What you should be saying is, "If the Lord wishes, we will live and do this or that."

But instead, you boast in your arrogance -I tell you - all such boasting is evil. Anyone, then, who knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, commits sin.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

P: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the tenth chapter. **C: Glory to you, O Lord.**

One day while Jesus was teaching, a lawyer stood up to find out if Jesus really knew what he was talking about.

The lawyer asked Jesus, "Teacher, tell me, what must I have done to inherit eternal life?"

So, Jesus said to him, "What has been written in God's law? What do you read there?"

The lawyer answered, "It says, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; [Dt 6:5] and your neighbor as yourself.'" [Lev 19:18]

And Jesus said to him, "You have given the right answer. Do this, and you will live."

But not wanting to look like he had asked an obvious question, the lawyer thought he could challenge Jesus by drilling down into his answer and ask, "Well, but, who is my neighbor?"

So, Jesus replied with a story. He said, "Once, there was a man who was walking on the road that goes from Jerusalem to Jericho. Along the way he was assaulted by robbers. They who stripped off all his clothes, beat him up badly, and left him on the side of the road, half-dead. Now, a little while later, a priest who, by chance, was also walking on the same road, came along and when this Priest saw the naked man laving halfdead, he made a point to pass by on the other side of the road. A little while later another priest, an even more important one, came past the same spot, saw the man beside the road and made sure to walk by on the other side. But then a Samaritan, someone who most of you profile as really stupid about how life works and being faithful to God is all about, came along with his donkey. Now, when this Samaritan saw the man on the side of the road, he went over to him, because the Samaritan was compassionate. The Samaritan immediately provided first-aid; bandaging the wounds, and sterilizing them by pouring oil and wine on them. Then the Samaritan put the injured man on the donkey and took him to an inn to provide more care for him. The next day the Samaritan had to continue his trip, so he gave the innkeeper a good amount of money and said, 'Please, take care of that man and when I come back in a few days, I will repay you whatever more you need to spend.""

Then Jesus asked the lawyer, "Which of these three people on the road do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?"

The lawyer said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."








Scout Chaplain: Let us pray;
