


First Lesson

<u>Isaiah 55</u>

isten! Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have ✓ no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear, and come to me. Listen, so that you may live. . . Seek "Adonai" while our God may be found. Call upon God while God is near. Let the wicked turn away from their ways, and the unrighteous their thoughts. Let them return to Adonai, that God may have mercy on them, and to our God, for God will abundantly pardon. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says Adonai. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it will not return to me empty, but it will accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it.

Second Lesson

1 Corinthians 1:18-31

S t. Paul wrote: The word of the cross is, on the one hand, to those perishing now, moronic. But to us, who are being saved now, it is the power of God. For it is written,

"I will utterly destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the cleverness of the clever I will reject." [Isaiah 29:14]

Where is the "wise?" Where is the "teacher?" Where is the "professor" of this age? Hasn't God made foolish the "wisdom" of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through Wisdom, God was pleased through the foolishness of the preaching of the Gospel to save those who believe its word. For Jews ask for signs and the Greeks seek wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, which to the Jew, on the one hand, is a scandal – undermining the Faith - but to Gentiles it is foolishness – pure nonsense. But to those of us who are called by God, both Jews and Greeks, the word of the cross is heard as God's power and God's wisdom. The reality is that the "foolishness" of

God is wiser than our "wisdom," and the "weakness" of God is stronger than our "strength." Consider your own call, brothers and sisters! Not many of you were "wise" by human standards. Not many of you were "powerful." Not many of you were considered to have exceptional character. But, the "foolish" of the world are the ones God chose so that God might shame the "wise." And the "weak" of the world are the ones God chose so that God might shame the "strong." And the "base" of the world and the things which the world despised - these God chose - things that did not seem to matter, so that God could reveal the unimportance of the things that did seem to matter. In this way no one can really boast about themselves on their own in the presence of God. But, we are in Christ Jesus, who became wisdom to us from God. He became the true Way of righteousness and sanctification and redemption so that - as it is written - "*The one boasting in the Lord, boast!*"

<u>Gospel</u>

D ut Jesus also told them a parable:

D "Someone who is blind does not have the power to lead along the Way someone else who is also blind, do they? Won't both of them fall into a pit?

A disciple is not above the teacher, but everyone will be strengthened as their teacher is. But, why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but the log in your own eye you do not see? How do you have the power to say to your neighbor, 'Neighbor, allow me – that I may cast out the speck in your eye,' – you, yourself, the log in your own eye are not seeing? Hypocrite! First, cast out the log from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to cast out the speck from your neighbor's eye.

For, no good tree makes rotten fruit, nor again does a rotten tree make good fruit. For each tree is known by its own fruit. For, it is not out of thorns that figs are gathered, nor from thorn bushes are clusters of grapes plucked. The good person, out of the good treasure of the heart, produces good, and the evil person, out of evil treasure, produces evil. For it is out of the abundance of the heart that our mouth speaks.

But, why do you call me 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say? Everyone who is coming to me and listening to my words and doing them - I will show you who that one is like. That one is like a man who, building a house, dug, and dug deeply, and laid the foundation on the rock. But, a flood rising, the river burst against the house of that one and it did not have the strength to shake it, because of its good construction. But, the one hearing and not doing, that one is like a man building a house on the ground, without a foundation. The river burst against it and immediately it collapsed in, and great was the destruction of that house."






