

Prelude & Confession

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit. Most holy and merciful God,

C: We have been tempted to turn away from the truth you offer us. We have doubted your presence, your power and your promise. Have mercy on us, O God.

A: We have shut our ears to your call to love and serve others with the same compassionate love and service Christ offers us.

C: We have not been diligent in staying keenly aware of how we can be a source of comfort, hope and sustenance to those who suffer, or are in despair, or deprived of what they need to live. We have found security in protecting and preserving our abundant blessings. Have mercy on us, O God.


P: We misuse and abuse the role you have given us in and over creation.

C: We exploit and squander the earth's resources without inconveniencing ourselves with consideration for the sustainability of life in the future. We assume the power of gods, but fail to seek the wisdom of God in the use of our power, focusing too much on our satisfaction in this moment rather than comprehending the full scope of our actions. We privilege our lives over the lives of other creatures without respect for the depth of the interconnectedness of all life. Have mercy on us, O God.

A: We do not always own our own problems, nor do we take enough responsibility for working to solve them.

C: We scapegoat, we make excuses, we get distracted. We do not bring them to you and open ourselves to the Spirit's guidance through unexpected voices and resources. We become discontented because we resign to empty contentment. We default to following the norm rather than clinging to the distinction of being a Child of God. Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.





P: The grace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: And also with you.

Prayer of the Day

P: The Lord be with you. C: And also with you.

First Lesson

Hebrews 11-12

Now "faith" is the essence of things being hoped for - practical proof that is not being seen. For, to this kind of "faith" the patriarchs of old bore witness. "Faith" understands that by the Word God creates the eons - the worlds were prepared by the word of God - so that what is not apparent becomes seen.

Faith – It was a superior sacrifice that Abel, rather than Cain, offered to God and through this there was a witness to righteousness – even God is witnessing this about the gift - and through this, in his dying Abel still speaks.

Faith - Enoch was taken so that he did not see death; and "he was not found, because God had taken him." For before "The Taking," it was witnessed that "he had pleased God," but, without Faith there is no power to please God, for it is necessary to have believed to be able to be approaching God – believed that God is – then whoever seeks God is among "The Rewarded."

Faith – Noah, having been warned about what was not yet being seen, and having constructed the ark with reverent obedience for the salvation of his household - by this the world was condemned and by this, according to Faith, "Righteousness" became the inheritor of the world.

Faith – When summoned, Abraham obeyed and went out from his home to the place which he received to live in as an inheritance. And he went out not knowing where he was to go! Faith - Living as a sojourner in the "Promised Land" while it belonged to others! Living in tents - as did

Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise - anticipating, then, the city having foundations, whose architect and builder is God. Faith - And Sarah, herself taken barren of "The Power," "The Heritage-laying," and "The seed-germinating," because Abraham was regarded as faithful to what God has been promising, therefore, from one (and this "one" was dying), generations innumerable come - "just as the stars in the heaven – "The Multitude" - and just as the sand that is on the shore by the sea." Faith – Abraham, when he was tested, offered Isaac, "The Only Son," the one given according to the promise, of whom Abraham had been told, "Your descendants will come through Isaac..."

Faith – Moses, when he was born, was hidden by his parents for three months because even when they saw that the child was beautiful, they were not afraid of the Pharoah's edict. Faith - Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called "A Son of Pharaoh's Daughter," choosing rather to share ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. . . Faith - Moses left Egypt, unafraid of the Pharoah's anger, for he persevered as though Moses saw God who is not invisible. Faith - Moses kept the Passover and the sprinkling of blood, so that the destroyer of the firstborn would not touch the firstborn of Israel. Faith - The people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. Faith - the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. Faith - Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.

And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets-- who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. . .

And therefore we - since there is such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us - unburdening ourselves of every weight that slows us and the hinderance of sin, with endurance may we run the race being set before us, fixing our sights on the one "Hero and Wholeness of Faith," Jesus, who for the joy being set out before him, endured the cross, having disregarded the shame, and taking the place at the right side of the throne of God. Indeed, contemplate him enduring this kind of opposition by the sinful so that you may not weary your souls and be faltering.

Do not remember the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for your goodness sake, O Lord!


Good and upright is the Lord; therefore the Lord instructs sinners in the way.

Instead, as Jesus who called you is holy, be holy vourselves in all your conduct; for it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."

Gospel Mark 8

Jesus continued on with his disciples, going into the villages of Caesarea Philippi.

On The Way Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?"

And the disciples spoke to him saying, "Some say you are John, "The Baptist;" and others say that you are the great prophet of old, Elijah; and others say you are any one of the prophets."

Then Jesus asked the disciples, "But, who do you say that I am?" Peter answered him by saying, "You are the Messiah."

The Jesus rebuked them. In this way, they would not tell anyone about him.

And calling the crowd to gather with his disciples, Jesus said to them all, "If someone is determined to follow after me, they must reject themselves and take up their cross and follow me. Those determined to save their soul will destroy it, and those who destroy their soul on account of me and the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and sell their soul? For what can they give in barter for their soul? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."
