

#### Prelude & Confession

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit. Most holy and merciful God,

C: we confess to you and to one another, and before the whole company of heaven, that we have sinned by our fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.

A: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength.

C: We diminish our respect and awe of You by not putting our relationship with you on the top of our priority list. We relegate You to being our god of convenience and comfort rather than the Creator of the Cosmos, and, in this way, we limit the power you have in our lives. Have mercy on us, O God.

A: We let other voices speak to us of fulfillment, hope and peace.

C: We have been tempted to turn away from the truth you offer us. We have doubted your presence, your power and your promise. Have mercy on us, O God.

A: We have shut our ears to your call to love and serve others with the same compassionate love and service Christ offers us.

C: We have not been diligent in staying keenly aware of how we can


be a source of comfort, hope and sustenance to those who suffer, or are in despair, or deprived of what they need to live. We have not shown hospitality to the sojourner. Instead, we find security in protecting and preserving our abundant blessings for ourselves. Have mercy on us, O God.

A: We misuse and abuse the role you have given us in and over creation.

C: We exploit and squander the earth's resources without inconveniencing ourselves with consideration for the sustainability of life in the future. We assume the power of gods, but fail to seek the wisdom of God in the use of our power, focusing too much on our satisfaction in this moment rather than comprehending the full scope of our actions. We privilege our lives over the lives of other creatures without respect for the depth of the interconnectedness of all life. Have mercy on us, O God.

A: We do not always own our own problems, nor do we take enough responsibility for working to solve them.

C: We scapegoat, we make excuses, we get distracted. We do not bring them to you and open ourselves to the Spirit's guidance through unexpected voices and resources. We become discontented because we resign to empty contentment. We default to following the norm rather than clinging to the distinction of being a Child of God. Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.

P: Let us pray:

C: Almighty God, in his parables, your son, our savior, teaches us the truths of your kingdom. Through the characters of these stories, we are called to reflect on the faithfulness of our own character. Draw us as deeply into your Word as the lawyer in today's parable, that we will not take the evaluative point of view of the bandits or priests, but clinging to the compassionate promise of your grace to us, we will open our hearts as compassionate "Samaritans" to all our neighbors. Bless us as fruitful agents of your radical reality. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

First Lesson Leviticus 6

Adonai, the Lord your God, charged me, Moses, to teach you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy so that you and your children and your children's children may fear Adonai, the Lord your God, all the days of your life, and keep all God's decrees and God's commandments that I, Moses, am commanding you so that your days may be long. Hear, therefore, O Israel, and observe them diligently, so that it may go well with you, and so that you may multiply greatly in a land flowing with milk and honey, as Adonai, the Lord, the God of your ancestors, has promised you.

Hear, O Israel: Adonai, our God, Adonai is One!

Now you are to love Yahweh your God with all your heart, and with all your being, and with all your substance! These words, which I, myself, am commanding you today, are to be upon your heart. You are to repeat them to your children and are to speak of them when sitting in your house and when you are walking on the way, and when you are lying down and when you are rising up. . . When your children ask you in time to come, "What is the meaning of the decrees and the statutes and the ordinances that Adonai, the Lord our God has commanded you?" then you shall say to your children, "We were Pharaoh's slaves in Egypt, but Adonai, the Lord, brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand. Adonai, the Lord, displayed before our eyes great and awesome signs and wonders against Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his household. God brought us out from there in order to bring us in, to give us the land

that God promised on oath to our ancestors. Then Adonai, the Lord, commanded us to observe all these statutes, to fear Adonai, the Lord our God, for our lasting good, so as to keep us alive, as is now the case. If we diligently observe this entire commandment before Adonai, the Lord our God, as God has commanded us, we will be in the right."

Psalm 90

Adonai, the Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations.

Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

You turn us back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you mortals." For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night.

You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers.

For we are consumed by your anger; by your wrath we are overwhelmed.

You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of your countenance. For all our days pass away under your wrath; our years come to an end like a sigh.

The days of our life are seventy years, or perhaps eighty, if we are strong; even then their span is only toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away.

Who considers the power of your anger? Your wrath is as great as the fear that is due you.

So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart.

Turn, O Adonai, the Lord,! How long? Have compassion on your servants!

Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

Make us glad as many days as you have afflicted us, and as many years as we have seen evil.

Let your work be manifest to your servants, and your glorious power to their children.

Let the favor of the Adonai, the Lord, our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands-
O prosper the work of our hands!

Second Lesson 1 Peter

Let our goal in all things must be unified in mind, sympathy, love for one another, compassion, and humbleness. We are not to be returning evil for evil or abuse for abuse; but blessing to all, because this is what we were called by God to do, so that a blessing we, too, might inherit a blessing. For it is written:

"Those striving to live life, love, and those desiring to see good days, keep their tongues from evil and their lips from speaking deceit; turning away from evil and doing good; seeking peace and pursuing it.

For, the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer.


But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil."

And who will be mistreating you if you may become a good Zealot? But even if you are actually caused to suffer because of your righteousness, you are blessed. Remember, their fear is not your fear, never may it be your anxiety. Instead, sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts, always with ready thoughtful responses to all those asking you about the Word in which you hope. Respond with gentleness and fear, having a good conscience, in order that when they try to slander you, it is they who will actually be put to shame by their mistreatment of you for your good conduct in Christ. For, suffering in doing good, if willed by the will of God, is far better than suffering for doing evil. For, Christ also suffered for sins once, for all, the righteous one for the unrighteous ones, so that you may approach God, having had your old self put to death, on the one hand, but having had your new self made alive, on the other.

### Gospel Acclamation

Gospel Luke 9

ne day while Jesus was teaching, a lawyer stood up to find out if Jesus really knew what he was talking about.

The lawyer asked Jesus, "Teacher, tell me, what must I have done to inherit eternal life?"

Jesus said to him, "What has been written in God's law? What do you read there?"

The lawyer answered, "It says, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; [Dt 6:5] and your neighbor as yourself." [Lev 19:18] And Jesus said to him, "You have given the right answer. Do this, and you will live."

But not wanting to look like he had asked an obvious question, the lawyer thought he could really challenge Jesus by drilling down into his answer and ask, "Well, but, who is my neighbor?"

So, Jesus replied with a story. He said, "Once, there was a man who was walking on the road that goes from Jerusalem to Jericho. Along the way he was assaulted by robbers. They stripped off all of his clothes, beat him up badly, and left him on the side of the road, half-dead. Now, a little while later, a priest who, by chance, was also walking on the same road, came along and when this Priest saw the naked man laying half-dead, he made a point to pass by on the other side of the road. A little while later another priest, an even more important one, came past the same spot, saw the man beside the road and made sure to walk by on the other side. But then a Samaritan, someone who most people profile as really stupid about how life works and being faithful to what God is all about, came along with his donkey. Now, when this Samaritan saw the man on the side of the road, he went over to him, because the Samaritan was compassionate. The Samaritan immediately provided first-aid; bandaging the wounds, and sterilizing them by pouring oil and wine on them. Then the Samaritan put the injured man on the donkey and took him to an inn to provide more care for him. The next day the Samaritan had to continue his trip, so he gave the innkeeper a good amount of money and said, 'Please, take care of that man and when I come back in a few days, I will repay you whatever more you need to spend."

Then Jesus asked the lawyer, "Which of these three people on the road do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?"

The lawyer said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.


He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

and the life everlasting. Amen


