

Prefude & Confession

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and the Holy Spirit. Most holy and merciful God,

C: we confess to you and to one another, and before the whole company of heaven, that we have sinned by our fault, by our own fault, by our own most grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone.

P: We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength.

C: We diminish our respect and awe of You by not putting our relationship with you on the top of our priority list. We relegate You to being our god of convenience and comfort rather than Creator of the Cosmos, and, in this way, we limit the power you have in our lives. Have mercy on us, O God.

P: We let other voices speak to us of fulfillment, hope and peace.

C: We have been tempted to turn away from the truth you offer us. We have doubted your presence, your power and your promise. Have mercy on us, O God.

P: We have shut our ears to your call to love and serve others with the same compassionate love and service Christ offers us.

C: We have not been diligent in staying keenly aware of how we can

be a source of comfort, hope and sustenance to those who suffer, or are in despair, or deprived of what they need to live. We have found security in protecting and preserving our abundant blessings. Have mercy on us, O God.

P: We misuse and abuse the role you have given us in and over creation.

C: We exploit and squander the earth's resources without inconveniencing ourselves with consideration for the sustainability of life in the future. We assume the power of gods, but fail to seek the wisdom of God in the use of our power, focusing too much on our satisfaction in this moment rather than comprehending the full scope of our actions. We privilege our lives over the lives of other creatures without respect for the depth of the interconnectedness of all life. Have mercy on us, O God.

P: We do not always own our own problems, nor do we take enough responsibility for working to solve them.

C: We scapegoat, we make excuses, we get distracted. We do not bring them to you and open ourselves to the Spirit's guidance through unexpected voices and resources. We become discontented because we resign to empty contentment. We default to following the norm rather than clinging to the distinction of being a Child of God. Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.



Prayer of the Day

P: The Lord be with you. C: And also with you

P: Let us pray:

C: Almighty God, in the parables, your son, our savior, spoke the truth about your kingdom. Through the characters of these stories, we are called to reflect on the faithfulness of our own character. As we now wait patiently and expectantly for the fullness of your Kingdom to finally be manifested, energize us to use the gifts we have received now, in this age, to produce the good things that inspire confident hope in the blessings of that age to come. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

First Lesson

Malachi 3

You have wearied Adonai, the Lord, with your words and still you ask, "how have we wearied the Lord?"

By saying, "All who do *evil* are good in the sight of Adonai, the Lord, and he delights in *them*."

Or by asking, "Where is the God of justice?"

Listen! I *am* sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and Adonai, the Lord, whom you seek will suddenly come to The Temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight--indeed, that messenger is coming, says Adonai, the Lord, of hosts.

But who can endure the day of the Lord's coming, and who can stand when the Lord appears? For, the Lord is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap. The Lord will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and the Lord will purify the religious and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to Adonai, the Lord, in righteousness. Then what the Lord's people offer to the Lord will be pleasing again to Adonai, the Lord, as in the days of old and as in former years.

Then I will draw near for judgment. I will be swift to bear witness against those who have thought they were the ones who manipulated and deceived others for their own gains; and against those who claimed a close and intimate relationship with me, but who gave their hearts to other gods in their lives; and against those claim to obediently follow my ways and my words, while knowing their own hypocrisy; against those who profit from participating in an economic system that exploits and oppresses the vulnerable and powerless; and against those who look down on and ignore the refugee in their land; and against those who do not respect and honor me, says Adonai, the Lord of the Heavenly Army.

L: The Word of the Lord! C: Thanks be to God!

Lord, you have been our refuge in all generations.

Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.

You turn us back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you mortals."

For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night.

You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers.

For we are consumed by your anger; by your wrath we are overwhelmed.

You have set our iniquities before you, our secret sins in the light of your countenance.

Turn, O Lord! How long? Have compassion on your servants!

Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.

Make us glad as many days as you have afflicted us, and as many years as we have seen evil.

Let your work be manifest to your servants, and your glorious power to their children.

Let the favor of Adonai, the Lord, our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands-O prosper the work of our hands!


Second Lesson

James 2

hat is the benefit, my friends, if you may say that you have "faith," but then may not do any "works?" Faith does not manifest salvation for you by itself - does it? For, if a brother or sister is not adequately clothed and lacks daily food and one of you says to them, "Go in peace! Keep warm! Eat your fill!" and then you do not

give them what is necessary for the body, what good is that to them or to you? So, "faith" is as good as dead if it is not manifested in works. Some of you say, "You have works and I have faith." Well, you can try to show me your faith apart from your works, but I, by my works, can certainly show you my faith. For instance, you believe that God is one – indeed, this is faith – but even the demons have this faith - and they shudder from their honest belief in this truth!! Do you wish to know, O empty person, how "faith" apart from "works" is inactive? Then, just remember our ancestor Abraham and how God proclaimed him to be "righteous" by the "work" he did in manifesting his "faith" in God when Abraham went up the mountain fully intending to sacrifice his son, Isaac, on the altar as God had commanded? [Gen 22:1-19] Pay attention to how this is a fine example of how Abraham's "faith" was active along with his works, and how "faith" is brought to completion by "works." Maybe now you can understand that a person's righteousness must be manifested in works that flow from faith and by faith on its own. Another example of this is Rahab, the prostitute of Jericho, who was declared righteous by manifesting her faith in doing the good work of welcoming and protecting God's agents when they came into her hostile city and then sent them back to their people safely by another road. For just as the "body" without the "Spirit" is "dead," so "faith" without "works" is also "dead."

Gospel Acclamation

P: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the nineteenth chapter. C: Glory to you, O Lord.

Gospel Luke 19

It as the disciples were listening to Jesus speak about the necessity of his suffering, dying and rising, he went on to tell a parable, because he was near Jerusalem, and because they were thinking that the kingdom of God was about to come to light. So Jesus said, "A certain well-born, dignified, courageous, and open-minded man went to a distant country to receive his kingdom and then return. But

went to a distant country to receive his kingdom and then return. But before he left, he called ten of his slaves and gave each of them a minas – let's call it \$100 - and said to them, 'Do what is practical with these while I am away.'

Now, the citizens of this man's kingdom hated him and sent a delegation after him, saying, 'It is not our will for him to be "king" over us."

When this man returned from receiving the kingdom, he gathered before himself those slaves he had given the silver to, so that he may know the results of their practical action.

And the first slave came forward saying, 'Lord, your one mina has been the source of ten mina.'

And the man said to him, 'Rejoice, good slave. Because in a tiniest thing you have been faithful, you now have authority over ten communities.' Then the second slave came, saying, 'Your mina, Lord, made five mina.' And the man said also to him, 'And you, be over five communities.' And then the other came, saying, 'Lord, behold, your one mina which I have removed from service by wrapping it in a death-veil, for, I am afraid of you, because you are an austere man; you take what you did not put there, and reap what you did not sow.'

The man then said to this slave, 'From your own mouth I will judge you, evil slave. You have known that I was an austere man, taking what I did not put there and reaping what I did not sow? Then how do you explain why you did not give my silver to the bankers and, by the time I had returned, it would have performed in earning some interest? Then the man said to those standing by, 'Take the mina from him and give it to the one who has ten minas.' (And they said to him, 'Lord, he has ten minas!') 'I tell you, all who are having, more will be given; but from those who do not have, even what they have will be taken away. Moreover, those who hate me and are not willing to have me be king

over them--bring them here and slav them in front of me."

After Jesus told this parable he continued forward, going up to Jerusalem.

P: The Gospel of the Lord. C: Praise to you, O Christ.



Apostles Creed

He ascended into heaven,


and is seated at the right hand of the Father.


Offertory Prayer
