

First Lesson


<u>Acts 10:34-43</u>

In the months after Jesus' resurrection the disciples went about teaching and preaching about Jesus. Peter was visiting with a Gentile, Cornelius, when he said, "I am completely convinced that God does not discriminate at all. Anyone, from any nation, or race, or religion who honors God and serves God is acceptable to God. You have heard of the message God sent to the people of Israel - the preaching of peace through Jesus, the Christ - Jesus is Lord of all!! - this is the message that spread throughout the country of Judea. It had its beginnings up in the area of Galilee right after the baptism that John talked about - how God first anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. Then the story continues with Jesus going around doing good things and healing anyone who was being oppressed by the devil. Jesus could do this because God was with him.

We, Jesus' disciples, are the witnesses who now testify to all that Jesus did, both in the countryside of Judea and in the city of Jerusalem. Jesus was eventually put to death by hanging him on a cross and then God awakened him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to everyone, but only to those of us who were chosen by God as witnesses. We, Jesus' disciples, are the ones who then ate and drank with him after he rose from death. Jesus then commanded us, his disciples, to preach to all people and to testify that Jesus is the one ordained by God as judge of both the living and the dead.

This Jesus is the one that all God's prophets of old testified about. And even they say that everyone - without exception – everyone who has faith in God's faithfulness receives forgiveness of sins through Jesus' name."

Second Lesson

<u>1 Corinthians 15</u>

Tow I, Paul, would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn listened to, which you now use as your evaluative point of view of the world, and through which you also are now being saved - that is, if you remain completely convinced by the message that I proclaimed to you - which you must be doing - otherwise, what's the point?! I passed along to you what had been passed along to me: that Christ died for our sins just as the scripture required, and that he was raised on the third day just as the scriptures required, and that he appeared to Peter, then to the twelve disciples. After that, Jesus appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters all at once - and most of them are still alive! - though, sadly, a few have died. Then Jesus appeared to James, and then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles - actually, I am not fit to be called an apostle because I seriously persecuted the church of God. But it is by the grace of God that I am now what I am

now! And I assure you that God's grace toward me has not been pointless! No, it is actually just the opposite because I worked harder than any of the other apostles--though it was not I who was doing this work, but the grace of God that is with me. But, regardless of whether it was me or the other apostles who proclaimed the message to you, it was proclaimed, and you have believed!


So, help me out here - if we have proclaimed that Christ was the one who was raised from the dead how can some of you say, "there is no resurrection of the dead?!" Because, if you are right that there is no resurrection of the dead then it must also be true that Christ has not been raised from the dead: and if it is true that Christ has not been raised then it must also be true that our proclamation to you was pointless and the faith that it stirred up in you is also pointless! Worse than that, if what you are saying about there being no resurrection from the dead is true then we are actually even misrepresenting God, because what we testified about God was that God raised Christ - whom God did not actually raise if what you say is true. As I just reasoned out for you: if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, then your faith is pointless. And then, here are the logical conclusions of your thinking that "the dead are not raised:" you are still in your sins, and even the faithful who have died in Christ have actually just, well, died, end of story. And I have to tell you that we are a pretty pitiful bunch of folks if our hope in Christ is only all about this life.

Fortunately, the truth is that Christ has been raised from the dead, the very first of all who have died. And the true logic is this: since death came into the world through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come in the world through a human being. Just as everyone dies in Adam, so also will everyone be made alive in Christ!




Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.


P: Let us Pray

- 6 King of glory, soul of bliss, everlasting life is this: thee to know, thy pow'r to prove, thus to sing, and thus to love!


