First Lesson

Dsaiah 53

Who has believed what we have heard? And to whom has the arm of Yahweh been revealed? For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with sickness; and as one from whom others hide their faces he was despised, and we held him of no account. Surely, he has borne our sickness and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by Elohim, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our rebellions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and Yahweh has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his

mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. Yet it was the will of Yahweh to crush him with sickness. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of Yahweh shall prosper. Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge. The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore, I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

The Lord redeems the life of the Lord's servants; none of those who take refuge in the Lord will be condemned.


Second Lesson


1 <u>Deter 4</u>

Christ suffered in flesh, so you need to have the same intention, so that his suffering to end sin will inspire you to suffer the suppression of being dominated by unfaithful desires

and submit to the Will of God for the time you remain alive in the flesh. For you have spent enough time doing the things unfaithful people do: sexual prejudice and abuse, responding to situations with unmeasured passion rather than care-full thoughtfulness, overindulgence, partying too much and putting trust in empty "gods." Others will be surprised that you no longer join them in these activities of excesses, and so they may say disrespectful things about God - they will have to explain themselves to our God who stands ready to judge the living and the dead. . . But the fulfillment of everything has come near. Have a solid evaluative point of view and be level-headed in your prayers. Above all, having intense, wholistic love for one another, for wholistic love covers a plethora of sins. Be hospitable to one another without grumbling. Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. If someone speaks, speak God's Word. If someone serves, serve as out of the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. To him belong the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen.

Nicene Creed


The Lord's Prayer


