## <u>Gospel</u>

Luke 8

A fter Jesus calmed the wind and the waves, he and his disciples sailed down to the country of the Gerasenes, which is across the lake from Galilee. As Jesus disembarked, this guy from the city who was possessed by demons met him. For a long time this guy had not lived in a house, but lived naked among the tombs. When he saw Jesus, this guy fell down before him and with a great voice said, "What is there between you and me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you not to torment me!" Now, on the hillside there a rather large herd of pigs was feeding and the demons strongly implored Jesus to let them enter these

pigs. So, Jesus gave them permission to go into the pigs and the demons came out of the man and entered the pigs. Then, the whole herd rushed down the steep bank and into the lake and they all drowned.

People came out to see what had happened. When they got to Jesus, they found the guy from whom the demons had gone out sitting at the feet of Jesus, fully dressed and in his right mind. And everyone was afraid. Those who had seen what had happened told the others how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. And everyone from all around the whole country of the Gerasene's asked Jesus to leave them; for they were gripped with great fear. And getting into the boat, Jesus headed back to where he came from.

But, as Jesus was embarking, that guy from whom the demons had gone out begged that he might be with Jesus.

But Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your home and share thoroughly how much God has done for you."

So, that guy went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.
