(Please stand and face the entrance)

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, for almost 70 weeks we have been God's people in the wilderness of the Covid experience. C: Scattered like Israel long ago, who sat by the rivers of Babylon longing to come back together on their holy ground again.

P: We have observed a fast from singing God's praises.

C: A discipline of love and care for ourselves and each other.

P: We have observed a fast from physical closeness.

C: A discipline of love and care for ourselves and each other.

P: We have observed a fast from gathering around the Lord's Table.

C: A discipline of love and care for ourselves and each other.

P: And God has blessed us in our fasting. Our love and care for ourselves and each other has meant we can now stand together, to break our fast.

C: To raise our voices in songs of praise. To stand next to each other as One People in Christ. To answer Jesus' invitation to come to his table and receive his gifts of grace; the renewing of life in bread and wine.

P: Before our fast is broken and our celebration begins, let us take a moment of silence to honor and call to God's remembrance those who were struck down in the Covid wilderness, those who are still suffering from the effects of their illness, those who are mourning, those who have exhausted themselves in caring for the sick and the dying, and the many throughout the world who are still very much in the midst of the wilderness . . . May the Lord abide with the dead, restore the sick and strengthen those who serve and bring hope to those still in the midst of the struggle. C: Amen.

P: I now declare our fasting to be at its end in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Lift your voices in song and come to the Feast! C: Amen, amen and amen!
