With all wisdom and with a right-evaluative-point-of-view, Christ has made known to us the mystery of the Father's will, according to the Father's pleasure that the Father purposed in Christ, to the proper stewardship of the fullness of the critical time, reconciling all of us in Christ, those in the heavens and those on the earth, in him. The king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it."


And Herod solemnly swore to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom."
