God Provides Manna & Quails for the Israelites in the Wilderness

The whole congregation of the Israelites set out from the area of Elim and Israel came to the wilderness of Sin, which is between the area of Elim and the desert of the Sinai on the fifteenth day of the second month after they had departed from the land of Egypt.

The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness.

The Israelites said to them, "If only we had died by the hand of Yahweh in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots, when we ate bread until we were satisfied! For you have brought us out into this wilderness to bring death to this whole assembly by starvation."

Yahweh said to Moses, "Look, I am going to rain bread from heaven for you all, and the people will go out and glean each day's amount in its day. In that way I will test them, to see whether they will follow my instruction or not. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days."

Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, "At sunset you will know that it is Yahweh who brought you out of the land of Egypt; at daybreak you will see the glory of Yahweh; when he harkens to your complaining against Yahweh. For, what are we, that you complain against us!?"

Moses said, "Since Yahweh gives you meat to eat at sunset, and at daybreak, bread to satisfy; since Yahweh harkens to your complaining that you utter against him--what are we?? Your complaining is not against us but against Yahweh!"

Moses said to Aaron, "Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, 'Come near, in the presence of Yahweh, for he has harkened to your complaining."

Now it was as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked toward the wilderness, and the glory of Yahweh could be seen in the cloud.

Yahweh spoke to Moses and said, "I have harkened to the complaining of the Israelites; say to them, 'In the evening you will eat meat, and at daybreak you will have your fill – you will be satisfied with bread. Then you will know that I am Yahweh your God.'"

Now it was at sunset a horde-of-quails came up and covered the camp; and at daybreak there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground.

When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, "*Mahn hu*/What is it?"

For they did not know what it was.

Moses said to them, "It is the bread that Yahweh has given you to eat. This is what Yahweh has commanded: 'Glean from as much of it as each of you needs, an omer to a person according to the number of "what you eat through and breathe through," everyone providing for those in their own tents.""

The Israelites did so, some gathering more, some less. But when they measured it with an omer, those who gleaned much had nothing over, and those who gleaned little had no shortage; they gleaned as much as each of them needed.

For the bread of God is the one coming down from heaven and giving life to the world." They said to him, "Lord, always give us this bread."

"I am the bread of life.

Whoever is coming to me may never have hunger, and whoever is having faith in me never may thirst."
