

Who among you loves life and desires long life to enjoy prosperity?


Keep your tongue from evil-speaking and your lips from lying words.

Second lesson Ephesians 5:15-20 (a continual reading)



Gospel John 6:51-58


Jesus continued teaching by saying . . . " I am the living bread that has come down from heaven. If anyone may eat from this bread, they will live into the age; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

Then the Jews quarreled with one another saying, "How does he have the power to give us the flesh to eat?"

So Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, if you may not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in yourselves. Those eating my flesh and drinking my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those eating my flesh and drinking my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live through the Father, so those eating me will live through of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. Those eating this bread will live into The Age."


