Ephesians 6:10-18

Finally, be empowered! in the Lord and in the dominance of the Lord's start in \mathbf{P} Lord's strength. Put on the whole armor of God so that you may have power to stand against the methods of the devil! Because our wrestling-match is not with blood and flesh, but with the rulers, with the authorities, with the world-dominators of this darkness - with the spiritually wicked in the heavens. For this reason take up the whole armor of God, so that you may have power to resist in that evil day, and having done everything, to stand. Stand, therefore! Put on the supportive athletic underwear of truth, and put on the breastplate of righteousness, and lace up your combat boots of the "readiness to proclaim the gospel of peace," always take up the shield of faith with which will have the power to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one, and allow the helmet of salvation to be placed on your head, and allow the sword of the Spirit to be put on your side - which is the Word of God. Pray in the Spirit at all times and in every one of your prayers and supplications - to that end, keep alert and always persevere in making supplications for all the saints.


And Jesus continued by saying, "For this reason I have said to you that no one has the power to come to me if they are not given to me from the Father."

P: Let us pray.




