First Lesson Amos 6

Amos, a great prophet of God, spoke the Word of God to God's people who had become unfaithful in their stiving to succeed in business, saying


. . .

Woo for those who are at ease in the Holy City, Jerusalem, and for those who feel secure on Holy Mount Samaria - those who are the notables of the first of the nations, on whom the whole people of God rely! Cross over to the foreign lands of Calneh and observe them carefully, then go from there to the foreign lands of Hamath the Great, then go down to the foreign land of Gath of the Philistines and see - are you really any better than these kingdoms? Is your territory greater than their territory? When, by your own schemes and plans, you attempt to be pushing away the inevitable day of disaster, you are actually only bringing nearer a seat of violence.

Woe for those who lie on beds of ivory, sprawling on their couches, eating lambs from the flock and calves from the stall - who sing songs to the sound of stringed instruments, and like the former King, David, improvise on instruments of music - who drink wine not from cups but from sacrificial bowls, and anoint themselves with the finest oils, but then are not absolutely sick over the ruin of God's people! Therefore, now they will be the first

of God's people to be sent into exile, and the revelry of these sprawlers will pass away.

Second Lesson

James 5

Come now, you who are rich, weep and wail for the miseries that are coming to you. Your riches have rotted, and your clothes are moth-eaten. Your gold and silver have rusted, and their rust will be evidence against you, and it will eat your flesh like fire. You have laid up the wrong kind of treasure for the last days. Listen! The wages of the laborers who mowed your fields, which you kept back by fraud, cry out, and the cries of the harvesters have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. You have lived on the earth in luxury and in pleasure; you have fattened your hearts in a day of slaughter. By your actions, you have condemned and murdered the righteous one, who does not resist you.

Be patient, therefore, my beloved, until the returning of the Lord. Behold, the farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, for the returning of the Lord is near. Beloved, do not grumble against one another, so that you may not be judged. See, the Judge is standing at the doors! As an example of suffering and patience, beloved, listen to the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. Indeed, we call those who showed endurance, blessed. You know that this is so because you have heard of the endurance of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

Gospel Luke 16

One day Jesus told the Disciples this parable . . .

nce upon a time there was a rich man who dressed in royal purples and the finest linens and enjoyed life every day.

And there was a poor man, named Lazarus, who had been thrown to the foot of the rich man's gate. He had open sores erupting all over his body and desperately desired to be satisfied by whatever was falling from the rich man's table. Instead, the dogs would come and lick his sores.

And as it happened, that the poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be held close in the heart of the great patriarch and father of God's people, Abraham.

The rich man also died and was buried.

In Hades, the rich man was existing in torment, and he lifted up his eyes and saw blessed Abraham far, far, away with Lazarus nestled in his heart.

And yelling out, the rich man said, 'Father Abraham, I command that you to have mercy on me, and I command that you send Lazarus to me so that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and may cool my tongue - for this flame makes me suffer.'

But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that you received what was 'good' in your life, and Lazarus, on the other hand, had it 'bad.' But, now, here, Lazarus is being spoken to with encouragement and you are being made to suffer. And besides, between you and us a great chasm has been established in order that those wishing to come over from here to you do not have the power to do so. Nor can you cross over from there to us.'

But the rich man said, 'Then, I entreat you, father, to send Lazarus to my father's house-- for I have five brothers—so that Lazarus may bear witness to them, so that my brothers will not also come into this place of torment.'

But Abraham said, 'Your brothers have Moses and the prophets; they are commanded to listen to them!'


But the rich man said, 'They will not listen to them, Father Abraham. But, if one may go to them from death, they will repent.'









The Lord's Prayer


