

First Lesson Isaiah 57

Who are you worried about? And who are you so afraid of that you would act so deceitfully and not remember me or even think about me? It is because I have been silent for so long that you are not afraid of me. So, now, I will recount your so-called "righteousness" and your so-called "good deeds," but they will not help you. Instead, when you cry out for help, let the idols you have turned to help you! Ah, a mere breath blows them all away. But the one who looks to me for help – they are the ones who will inherit the promised land and they will have access to my holy mountain."

### Second Lesson

1 Peter 2

Rid yourselves, therefore, of all malice, and all guile, insincerity, envy, and all slander. Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation--if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Coming to the Lord as a living stone - being rejected, on the one hand, yet, chosen and precious according to God - and as living stones, let yourselves be built as a spiritual house, into a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

For it stands in scripture:

"See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious;

and whoever believes in this one will not be put to shame." [Isaiah 28:15]

To you, then, who are believing, this "cornerstone" is priceless; but for those who are not believing,

"The stone that the builders rejected has been made into the very head of the corner," [Ps 118:22]

and

"A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that causes scandal." [Isaiah 8:14]

They stumble because they disobey the word - as they were destined to do. But, you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for possession, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of the One who called you out of darkness into the marvelous light.

Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. [Hosea 1:9; 2:23]

## Gospel Acclamation

## Gospel Luke 20

One day, close to the time of his crucifixion, as Jesus was teaching the people in the temple and telling the good news, the chief priests and the

scribes came with the elders asking him questions . . . Jesus told the people this parable:

nce upon a time, there someone planted a vineyard, rented it out to a group of farmers, and then went off to another country for a good while.

When the critical time of the harvest season came, the vineyard owner sent a servant to the farmers to collect the fruit of the vineyard. But those tenant farmers beat him and sent the servant away, empty-handed.

Next, the guy sent another servant to collect his share of the produce. The tenants also beat and insulted this servant, sending him away empty-handed.

The guy sent still a third servant, but the tenants also wounded this one and threw him out.

Then the Lord of the Vineyard said, 'What should I do? I will send my son, the Beloved. They will probably respect him.'

But when the farmers saw him, they dialogued among themselves, deciding, 'He is the inheritor. When we kill him, the inheritance will be ours.'

So, they threw the son, the Beloved, out of the vineyard and killed him.

What, then, will the owner of the vineyard do to them? He will come and evict these farmers and give the vineyard to others."

When the Jewish Religious Leadership in the Temple heard this parable they responded, "That is nonsense!"
But, Jesus looked directly at them and said, "What, then, does this text mean:

'The stone that has been rejected by the builders This very one has become the cornerstone'?[Ps 118:22]

Everyone falling on that stone will be crushed together into pieces; and upon whom it may fall, it will winnow."

The Jewish Religious Leadership were seeking to lay hands on Jesus at that very hour, but they were afraid of the people, for the people realized that Jesus had told this parable against the Religious Leadership. The Religious Leadership watched him closely and sent spies who pretended to be righteous so that they could trap Jesus by his own words, and the Religious Leadership could then hand Jesus over to the rule and authority of the Roman Governor.




Apostles Creed




# The Lord's Prayer




