Second Lesson

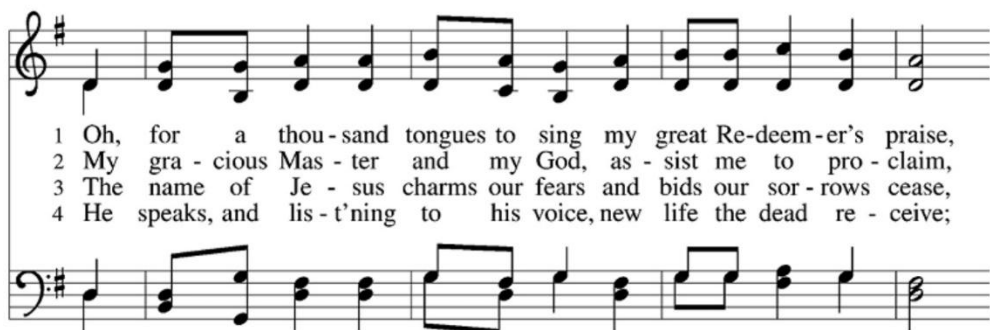
Galatians 2

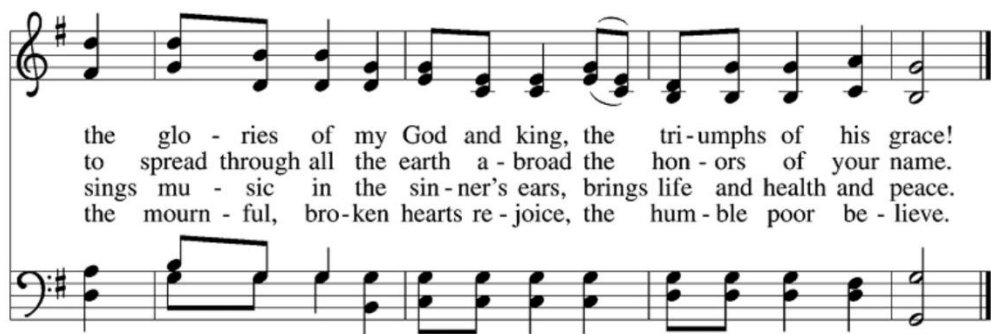
We know that a person is not justified by works of the Law, but through faith of Jesus, Christ! And we have faith in Christ, Jesus, so that it is from Christ's faith that we have been justified and not by doing the works of the law – because works of the Law will not justify all flesh. But, if while we are seeking to be justified in Christ, we are still found to be sinners – what, then?! – is Christ a servant of Sin? Certainly not! But, if I “build up” again the very things that I once “tore down” – if I return to sin – then I demonstrate that *I* am the one who is the transgressor, not Christ. The truth is that, in Christ, I “died” to the Law through the Law so that I might “live” in God's eyes. I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live but, it is Christ lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh, I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. My sin does not nullify the grace of God! For, if justification comes only through obedience to the Law, then Christ died for nothing.

Luke 19

Jesus takes over the Temple

In his last days, Jesus entered the Temple and began to cast out those who were selling the things visitors needed for worship in the Temple. He said, "It is written,

'My house will be a Prayer House;'

'but you have made it a Bandit's Cave.'

Every day Jesus was teaching in the temple. But, the Chief Priests, the Scribes, and the leaders of the people seek for a way to destroy him. And, yet they could not find anything they could do, because all the people were held in suspense by him, listening. . . And they, having watched closely, sent spies who were pretending they are righteous, so that they may catch Jesus by his word, so as to hand him over to the rule and the authority of the Governor.

And they questioned him, saying, "Teacher, we have known that you are right in what you speak and teach, and you do not save face, but always teach the truth about the Way of God - Is it right we give Ceaser tribute, or not?"

But having understood their craftiness, Jesus said to them, "Show me a coin! Whose image and whose title does it have?"

They said, "Ceaser's."

But Jesus said to them, "Then hand back to Caesar, what is Caesar's, and to God, what is God's."

And they did not have the strength to catch him by his Word in the presence of the people, but, having been amazed by his answer, they were silent.

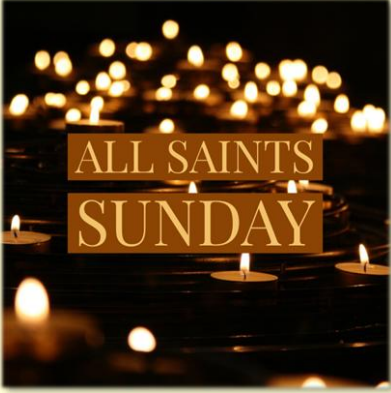
