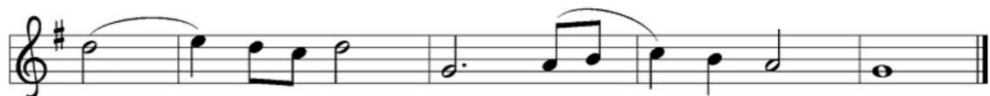

As some are speaking about The Temple - how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God - Jesus said, "As for these things that you see, the days will come in which this will not be permitted - stone upon stone - the will be none that are not separated." But they asked him, "Teacher, when then, will this be? And what will be the sign that this is about to take place?" But, Jesus said, "See that you are not deceived! For, many will come in my name saying, 'I am him!' and 'The critical moment is near!' You may not be caused to go after them. But whenever you may hear of wars and insurrections, you may not cause to be terrified, for it is divinely ordained that these things take place first, but the fulfillment of all things will not follow right away."

Then Jesus says to them, "Nation will rise up over nation, and kingdom over kingdom. There will be great earthquakes, and, in various places, famines and plagues and fearful sights and great signs from heaven. But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and they will persecute you. They are handing you over into the synagogues and prisons - carrying you before kings and governors on account of my name. This will turn you in a witness. Therefore, put it into your hearts to not prepare your well-reasoned arguing ahead of time! For, I will give you a mouth and a wisdom that none of your opponents will have the power to resist or contradict. But you will be handed over - even by parents, and brothers and sisters, and relatives and friends - and they will put some of you to death. And you will be hated by all because of my name. But not a hair of your head will be destroyed. In your endurance, you obtain your life.

Nicene Creed
