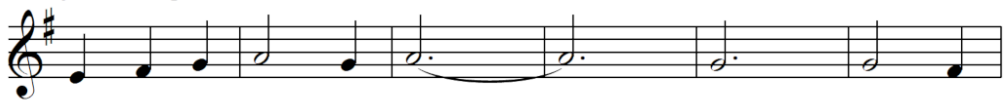

First Lesson

Jeremiah 33

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a "Righteous Branch" to spring up for David and that Branch will execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which the Branch will be called, "The Lord is our righteousness." For thus says the Lord: David will never lack someone to sit on the throne of the house of Israel . . . If any of you could break my covenant with the day and break my covenant with the night, so that day and night would not come at their appointed time, only then could my covenant with my servant David be broken, so that he would not have a son to reign on his throne . . .

Just as the host of heaven cannot be numbered and the sands of the sea cannot be measured, so I will increase the offspring of my servant David . . .

Have you not observed how these misguided people say, "The two families that the Lord chose have been rejected by him," and how they hold my people in such contempt that they no longer regard them as a nation? Only if I had not established my covenant with day and night and the ordinances of heaven and earth would I reject the offspring of Jacob and of my servant David and not choose any of his descendants as rulers over the

offspring of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. For, I will restore their fortunes and will have mercy upon them.

Second Lesson

Hebrews 1

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days God has spoken to us by a Son, whom God appointed heir of all things, through whom God also created the worlds. This Son is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and this Son sustains all things by his powerful word. When the Son had made purification for sins, the Son sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become much superior to angels, for the name the Son has inherited is more excellent than theirs. For to which of the angels did God ever say,

"You are my Son; today I have begotten you"? [Psalm 2:7]

Or again,

"I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? [2 Samuel 7:14]

And again, when God brings the firstborn into the world, God

says,

"Let all God's angels worship him." [Deut 43:33 & Psalm 97:7]

Of the angels God says,

"God makes the angels winds, and God's servants flames of fire."

[Psalm 104:4]

But of the Son, God says,

*"Your throne, O God, is forever and ever,
and the righteous scepter is the scepter of your kingdom.
You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness;

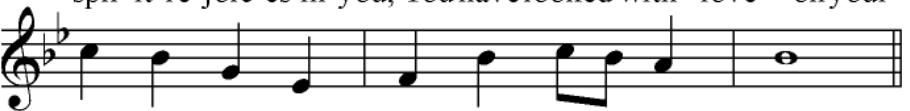


