With full trust in God's power and intentions to accomplish all that God has spoken, let us come now with renewed hearts, minds and souls to offer our gifts of prayer, praise and thanksgiving.

<u>First Lesson</u>

Jeremiah 33

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he will execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: "The Lord is our righteousness." For thus says the Lord: David will never lack someone to sit on the throne of the house of Israel . . . If any of you could break my covenant with the day and my covenant with the night, so that day and night would not come at their appointed time, only then could my covenant with my servant David be broken, so that he would not have a son to reign on his throne . . .

Just as the host of heaven cannot be numbered and the sands of the sea cannot be measured, so I will increase the offspring of my servant David . . .

Have you not observed how these people say, "The two families that the Lord chose have been rejected by him," and how they hold my people in such contempt that they no longer regard them as a nation? Only if I had not established my covenant with day and night and the ordinances of heaven and earth would I reject the offspring of Jacob and of my servant David and not choose any of his descendants as rulers over the offspring of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. For, I will restore their fortunes, and will have mercy upon them.

Second Lesson

Hebrews 1

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days God has spoken to us by a Son, whom God appointed heir of all things, through whom God also created the worlds. This Son is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and this Son sustains all things by his powerful word. When the Son had made purification for sins, the Son sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become much superior to angels, for the name the Son has inherited is more excellent than theirs. For to which of the angels did God ever say,

"You are my Son; today I have begotten you"? Or again,

"I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"? And again, when God brings the firstborn into the world, God says, "Let all God's angels worship him."

Of the angels God says,

"God makes the angels winds, and God's servants flames of fire."

But of the Son, God says,

"Your throne, O God, is forever and ever, and the righteous scepter is the scepter of your kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness; therefore God, your God, has anointed you with the oil of gladness beyond your companions."





The Annunciation to Mary

In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary.

And the angel came to her and said, "Greetings to one who is favored! The Lord is with you."

But Mary was very perplexed by the angel's words and thought about what sort of greeting this might be.

The angel said to Mary, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found grace with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and will bear a son, and you will name him "Jesus." He will be great and will be called "The Son of the Most High," and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob into the eons, and of his kingdom there will be no completion."

Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I do not know a man?"

The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be holy. He will be called the "Son of God." And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month for her - who was said to be barren! - because every word of God is not beyond God's power to accomplish."

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. 



