P: The child who came into the world long ago in the simplicity of the manger and who will come again in great glory, is the sign for us that God is with us, now and always, forgiving our sins, liberating us from our limitations and turning us back to living ever more faithfully. With full trust in God's power and intentions to accomplish all the words that God has spoken, let us come now with renewed hearts, minds and souls to offer our gifts of prayer, praise and thanksgiving.

First Lesson

Genesis 17:15-22

God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her name "Sarai," for "Sarah / Princess" is her name. I will bless her, and I will give you a son by her. I will bless her, so she becomes nations; kings of peoples shall come from her."

But Abraham fell on his face and laughed.

He said in his heart, "Can a child be born to a man who is a hundred years old? Can Sarah, who is ninety years old, bear a child?"

And Abraham said to God, "If only my son by Sarai's servant Hagar, Ishmael, might live in your sight!"

Psalm The Great "O Antiphons" of the Advent Season

These Antiphons are an Advent tradition throughout the Church. Each one begins with a name for Christ and reflects one of his attributes in scripture.

Second Lesson

Revelation 12:1-12

And a great sign was seen in heaven: a woman enwrapped with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. And she is pregnant, and she cries out, laboring, and struggling mightily to deliver.

And another sign was seen in heaven: behold, a great dragon, red-hot, having seven heads and ten horns, and on his heads, seven diadems. And his tail drags a third of the stars of heaven and throws them into the earth. And the dragon stood right in front of the woman verging on delivery, so that whenever she might birth her baby, he might gobble it up.

And she birthed a male son, who is about to shepherd all the ethnicities with an iron rod that cannot be broken. But her child was snatched away and taken to God and to God's throne and the woman fled into the wilderness where she has a place prepared for her from God, so that there the angels may nourish her for one thousand two hundred and sixty days.

And a war began in heaven; Michael and his angels fought with the dragon. The dragon and his angels fought, they were not strengthened, and there was no place for them in heaven. And the great dragon, the ancient serpent, the one being called "Devil" and "The Satan," who is leading astray the whole inhabited world was thrown. He was thrown into the earth, and his angels were thrown with him.

Then I heard a great voice in the heaven speaking, "Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of God's Messiah, because thrown into the earth is the accuser of our comrades, the one accusing them before our God day and night. And they have conquered him on account of the blood of the Lamb and on account of the word of their witnessing - they did not love their lives over death. By this, rejoice then, you heavens and those dwelling in them! Alas, the earth and the sea, for the devil has come down to you with great wrath, because he knows that his critical time is short!"



Gospel Acclamation

Gospel Luke 1:57-80

And when Elizabeth's due date arrived she gave birth to a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had declared his great mercy with her, and they joined her in rejoicing. In obedience to God's Law, on the eighth day, they brought the child to be circumcised. The people gathered there were calling the child "Zechariah" after the name of his father, Zechariah.

But his mother said, "No! He is to be called 'John.'"

They said to her, "But, none of your relatives has this name."

Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him.

Zechariah asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is 'John'."

And all of them were amazed. Immediately, his mouth was opened, and his tongue was freed and he began to speak, praising God. And it came about that fear overcame all their neighbors, and throughout the entire hill country of Judea everyone was talking about these words.

They took all that they were hearing to heart, wondering, "What, then, will this child become?" For indeed, the mighty hand of the Lord was with the child.

Then the child's father, Zechariah, was filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke this prophecy: "Speak well of the Lord God of Israel, for the Lord has looked favorably on the Lord's people and redeemed them and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of the Lord's child, David, as the Lord spoke through the mouth of the Lord's holy prophets from of old, that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us. The Lord has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors, and has been caused to remember the holy covenant, the oath that was sworn to our ancestor, Abraham, to grant us that we, being rescued from the hands of our enemies, might worship the Lord without fear, in holiness and righteousness before the Lord all our days. And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High. For you will go before the Lord to prepare The Way - to give knowledge of salvation to the Lord's people by liberation from their sins. By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us to give light to those sitting in darkness and in the shadow of death - to guide our feet into the way of peace."

The child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the day he was manifested to Israel.

Nicene Creed


