Nehemiah 9:5

Blessed be your glorious name, which is exalted above all blessing and praise."

And Ezra said: "You are the Lord, you alone; you have made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth and all that is on it, the seas and all that is in them. To all of them you give life, and the host of heaven worships you. You are the Lord, the God who chose Abram and brought him out of Ur of the Chaldeans and gave him the name Abraham; and you found his heart faithful before you, and made with him a covenant to give to his descendants land . . . and you have fulfilled your promise, for you are righteous. And you saw the distress of our ancestors in Egypt and heard their cry at the Red Sea. You performed signs and wonders against Pharaoh and all his servants and all the people of his land, for you knew that they acted insolently against our ancestors. You made a name for yourself, which remains to this day. And you divided the sea before them, so that they passed through the sea on dry land, but you threw their pursuers into the depths, like a stone into mighty waters. Moreover, you led them by day with a pillar of cloud, and by night with a pillar of fire, to give them light on the way in which they should go. You came down also upon Mount Sinai, and spoke with them from heaven, and gave them right ordinances and true laws, good statutes and commandments, and you made known your holy sabbath to

them and gave them commandments and statutes and a law through your servant Moses. For their hunger you gave them bread from heaven, and for their thirst you brought water for them out of the rock, and you told them to go in to possess the land that you swore to give them. But they and our ancestors acted presumptuously and stiffened their necks and did not obey your commandments; they refused to obey and were not mindful of the wonders that you performed among them; but they stiffened their necks and determined to return to their slavery in Egypt. But you are a God ready to forgive, gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and you did not forsake them. Even when they had cast an image of a calf for themselves . . . Forty years you sustained them in the wilderness so that they lacked nothing; their clothes did not wear out and their feet did not swell. And you gave them kingdoms and peoples . . . You multiplied their descendants like the stars of heaven and brought them into the land that you had told their ancestors to enter and possess. . . . Nevertheless, they were disobedient and rebelled against you and cast your law behind their backs and killed your prophets, who had warned them in order to turn them back to you, and they committed great blasphemies. Therefore, you gave them into the hands of their enemies, who made them suffer. Then in the time of their suffering they cried out to you, and you heard them from heaven, and according to your great mercies you gave them saviors who saved them from the hands of their enemies. But after they had rest, they again did evil before you, and you abandoned them to the hands of their enemies, so that they had dominion over them; yet when they turned and cried to you, you heard from heaven, and many times you rescued them according to your mercies. And you warned them in order to turn them back to your law. Yet they acted presumptuously and did not obey your commandments, but sinned against your ordinances, by the observance of which a person shall live. . . Now therefore, our God - the great and mighty and awesome God, keeping covenant and steadfast love - do not treat lightly all the hardship that has come upon us . . . You have been just in all that has come upon us, for you have dealt faithfully and we have acted wickedly . . .



Reading

Colossians 3

Paul writes . . . If, therefore, you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, sitting to the right of God, taking the point of view from above, not from earth, for you have died, and your life is being concealed with Christ in God! When Christ who is your life may be revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory!

You must, then, put to death the things within you that are “earthly”: fornication, uncleanness, anxiety, evil longings, and covetousness (the thinking that if only you had what others have your life would be better - which is idolatry)! Through these comes the wrath of God. You walked about in these ways when you were living as “earthly people.” But now you must not let your mouth speak such things: harsh expressions from internal churnings, rages that cause you to pant and sweat, words that are intended to cause harm, blasphemy (saying things about God that are not true), and dishonorable words. Do not be deceitful with one another. Seeing that you have stripped off the old self with those old practices and having clothed yourselves with the new, be renewed by the knowledge which comes from the One who created you: that there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all! Clothe yourself as God's “Chosen Ones,” holy and loved, with the tender mercies of compassion, pity, kindness, with a humble evaluative point of view of yourself, being gentle and long-suffering, bearing with one another and, being gracious even if you may have a reason to accuse another of wrong-doing to you, just as the Lord has been gracious to you, so you must be gracious to one another. Then to all these things add all-encompassing love, which is a bond of completeness. And let the peace of Christ arbitrate in your hearts, to which you were called in one body. And be thankful! Let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly; teaching with Wisdom and admonishing one another with psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, with grace, singing in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Luke 12

Jesus said to his disciples, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life - what you may eat, or about your body - what you may wear. For life is more than food, and the body is more than clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. How much more are you worth than the birds! And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? If then you are not being empowered to do so small a thing, why do you worry about the rest? Consider the lilies and how they grow: they neither toil nor spin yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But, if God so clothes the

grass of the field which is alive today and tomorrow is being thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you--you of little faith! And you, do not keep striving for what you may eat and what you may drink, and do not be made wobbly. For it is the nations of the world that strive after all these things, and your Father knows that you need them. Instead, strive for his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well. 
