- P: Let your steadfast love, O Lord, abide with us as we hope in your word.


C: Amen.



















Rost Communion Rrayer & Commendation

With our bodies yearning to embrace yours just once more,


With our minds full of memories and mourning,

"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" . . . thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

Although you have not seen the Lord, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, for you are receiving the fulfillment of your faith, the salvation of your soul.

For this reason, you all must get your minds ready; be attentive and aware; set all your hope on the grace being brought to you in the revelation of Jesus Christ. Like obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires that you were formerly following in ignorance. Instead, as Christ who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in all your conduct; for it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy."
